

INCOMING FIRST GRADE SUMMER READING REQUIREMENTS AND SUGGESTED TITLES

Please note that many of these books are available through the St. Louis County Library and can be requested and reserved online. Some of the titles will be in demand; it helps to make those requests early in the summer.

Students entering first grade in the fall of 2016 are required to read the two books listed below:

**1. *Biscuit Goes to School* by Alyssa Capucilli –
Download and complete the “1st Grade Biscuit
Activity”**

**2. Pick a NON-FICTION DK Reader that is appropriate
for your child’s reading ability. Examples: *Rockets and
Spaceships, Fishy Tales, Ponies and Horses, Meet the
Dinosaurs*, etc.**

**-Activity: Write two complete sentences about what you
learned reading.**

Students should read at least 20 minutes daily. **It is also
recommended that parents read to their children to build
vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.**

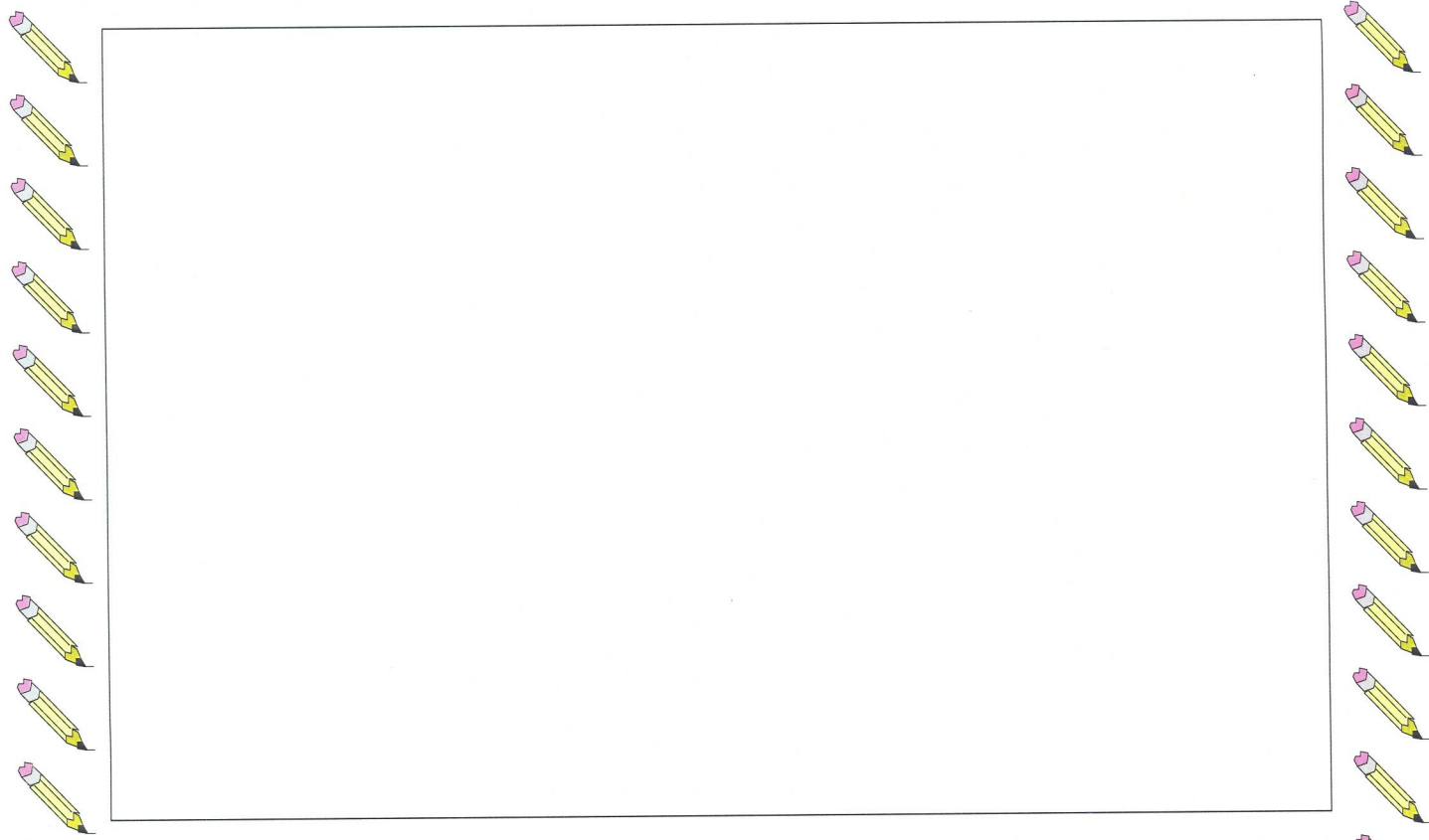
